Suna soon to be with Sydney

SYDNEY – A traffic management service that has been running successfully in Melbourne since August 2007 will be trialled in Sydney's CBD shortly. The Suna traffic channel service delivers real-time information about traffic congestion – and suggested routings past blockages – through compatible satellite navigation systems.

“Suna will be much welcomed by Sydney motorists looking to avoid lengthy road delays and other incidents,” said Intelematics Australia CEO Adam Game. “Intelematics is looking to soon begin trialling the service in Sydney and is aiming to begin rolling out the service for the CBD during the next few months.”

Intelematics is a subsidiary of the Royal Automotive Club of Victoria (RACV).
